Guntur Workshop paves the way forward for the project!

Cities delegations and ICLEI staff (from Europe, South Asia and Southeast Asia) flocked to the fascinating and culturally-diverse country of India last September 25-30, 2006 for the 3rd Partners' Meeting hosted by Guntur Municipal Corporation (GMC).

The main goals of the Partners' Meeting were to verify the progress of the part-



ners in implementing the ecoBudget; review the Environmental Master Budgets of both Guntur and Tubigon, discuss project management issues and carry on the initial preparation of an Asian version of the ecoBudget manual.

Guntur showcased their targets, as well as on-going and planned measures relevant to their Environmental Master Budget. Their priority areas are water quality and quantity, waste management, urban greening and air quality. During the city tour, Bologna delegates (who had been to Guntur twice previously) were impressed with the great improvements particularly on street maintenance (i.e. cleanliness, structures, organisation of hawkers).

Atty. Juanito Cambangay (the Local Project Manager of Bohol), Engr. Noel Mendana (Municipal Planning & Development Officer & Team Leader of the Local Implementing Team) and Mr. Marlon Amila, (elected councillor & member of the Local Implementing Team) represen-

ted Bohol. Tubigon highlighted their ongoing measures. For several indicators, like in the case of accounting for nonrevenue water and no. of households segregating their waste, Tubigon has already exceeded its targets.

The workshop was also an opportunity for partners to compare and contrast administrative/political systems, environmental issues and community response. Among the events within the workshop the meeting with District Collector Mrs Jayalakshmi plays an outstanding role. The District Collector is an officer of the Indian Administrative Service and is the most powerful government official of the district. Mrs Jayalakshmi posed several questions about the project and also advised on integrating ecoBudget with existing other projects, so that on each and every project environmental resources can be taken care of.

The workshop was enriched by technical visits (including the water testing laboratory established at Takkellapadu and two



water reservoirs were almost completed at LB Nagar and SVR Thota) and cultural sightseeing (the enormous chilli market, the self-help group at Kolping Centre, an entertainment park for children living in suburbs and old temples).

Press and television were actively present during the whole workshop and interviewed not only Guntur's politicians (Mayor Kanna Nagaraju, Deputy Mayor Murali Mohan, Commissioner D. Rama Rao and ex-Mayor and Project Coordinator Ch. Yesuratnam) but also the guests from Europe and the Philippines.



During the evenings receptions at Gandhi Park, Crazy World Water Park and Mayor's Residence offered the participants samples of Indian music and dance and helped the group to create a strong and friendly atmosphere.

LAST MINUTE Tubigon and Guntur approve Master Budgets 2007!

On 22nd December 2006 Tubigon City Council presented a welcome Christmas gift to the population: Master Budget 2007, with new ambitious target have been unanimously approved!

At the end of January 2007 The City Council of Guntur Municipal Corporation did the same, after a long and discussed debate.

BIG ECHO OF THE INDIAN PRESS AND MEDIA FOR ecoBUDGET - ASIA!

During the workshop in Guntur, project partners from Bologna, Bohol, Växjö and ICLEI staff from Europe, South Asia and Southeast Asia who visited the city, were in awe of the Indian media. This event caught, in an overwhelming way, the media and press attention during the four days of the Workshop. Many newspapers like Andhra Jyothi, Andhra Prabha, Vaartha, The New Indian Express, Eenadu, The Hindu and many others, published several articles daily, both in English and in Telugu, the official language in Andhra Pradesh state. The press release was so astonishing that, in many cases ecoBUDGET dominated the cover pages of the newspapers.

This article aims to compile and convey the press releases, in order to highlight the influence that the ecoBUDGET-Asia project has on the city of Guntur.

...BEING RECOGNISED AS OUTSTANDING INTERNATIONAL PROJECT ecoBUDGET-ASIA presented at the Third GEF Assembly in CapeTown, 28-30 August 2006

The Assembly is the governing body of the Global Environmental Facility in which representatives of all 176 member countries participate. It meets every three to four years, and is responsible for reviewing and evaluating the GEF's general policies, the operation of the GEF, and its membership. During the Assembly a side event on ecoBudget-Asia took place. Prof. Johan Nel from North-West University Potchefstroom (South Africa) welcomed all participants to the event and introduced the speakers and session details. In his presentation he explained the importance of conserving natural resources and ecoBUDGET as tool for urban environmental management. He explained the successful implementation of ecoBUDGET in European cities and now pilot implementation on in Asian cities. Finally he stressed the application of ecoBudget is not only limited to local level it can also be adopted for regional or national level. Mr Paolo Natali, President of the Environmental Committee of Bologna City Council, showed Bologna's case in relationship to change of ruling majority.

Ms Joy Bailey, ICLEI South-East Asia and Mr Anurag Mishra, ICLEI South Asia presented the pilot implementation of ecoBudget-Asia funded by European Commission at Province of Bohol in Philippines and Guntur city in India. Ms Bailey explained the importance of ecoBudget in terms of addressing the issue of Poverty at the Municipality of Tubigon. Mr. Mishra informed the adoptability of ecoBudget in Indian local conditions and its demand by other cities in the region. Following issues were raised by participants, selection of focal areas, defining indicators for Master Budget, integration of ecoBUDGET with other programs of ICLEI like CCP, Water Campaign, LAB and others.

Växjö wins Sustainable Energy Europe Award 2007!

During the European Sustainable Energy Week, which took place between 29 January and 2 February 2007, the Sustainable Energy Europe Award 2007 was presented to outstanding projects that support the achievement of the EU's energy policy targets. Our European partner, the city of Växjö, which is also one of the European Cities for Climate Protection (CCP)TM Cities of Ambition, received the award in the category Sustainable Communities. The award was won in recognition of the city's work on Fossil Fuel Free Växjö.



Văxjö took the decision in 1996 to become a fossil fuel free city to reduce the human impact on climate change. Between 1993 and 2005 the emissions of CO2 from fossil fuels were reduced by 24% per inhabitant and the share of renewable energy is now over 50%. The Fossil Fuel Free Växjö program incorporates different types of activities, such as biomass-based district heating and power generation, district cooling, biomass boilers for households, energy efficient street lightning, energy efficient construction, use of solar panels, cycle paths, environmental friendly cars, biogas production, large scale bio-DME production etc. The city thereby expects to meet its target by 2010.
